
# WA POLICY Habor FORUM (WAPF) OUR PARTY'S POLICY

## Introduction to the WAPF

DEVELOPMENT PROCESS

As part of the 2023 Rules Review, and the adoption of new Party Rules at the State Conference in November 2023, a new body has been established called the WA Policy Forum (WAPF).

The WAPF is responsible for developing our draft Party Platform before each State Conference in consultation with members and Party Units. It is made up of:



### **WAPF Party Member Forums**

One of the ways that the WAPF will engage Party members in policy development, will be through a series of policy forums.

All members will be invited to attend (with online access provided for regional members).

The forums will be structured around different areas of policy, and provide an opportunity for party members to attend and engage with WAPF delegates, Members of Parliament and Ministers about their policy ideas.


